

# 2022 Priorities for New HUD CoC Funded Projects

## Project Priorities

### HUD Permanent Supportive Housing (PSH)

- Priority 1: Projects for Single Adults or Single Youth 18-24 in Olmsted County
- Priority 2: Single Adults or Single Youth 18-24 in Blue Earth, Steele, or Rice/Goodhue County areas

### HUD Rapid Rehousing or Joint Component Rapid Rehousing & Transitional Housing (non-DV)

- Priority 1: Projects for single adults/single youth in Olmsted County
- Priority 2: Projects for single adults/single youth in Blue Earth, Steele, or Rice Counties

### HUD Rapid Rehousing or Joint Component Rapid Rehousing & Transitional Housing DV (Domestic Violence)

- Priority 1: Projects in Olmsted, Blue Earth, or Rice/Steele County areas (no household type priority)
- Priority 2: Multi-county projects anywhere else in region (no household type priority)

## How Priorities were selected

### Data Sources

- Coordinated Entry Data (CE Monitoring Report in HMIS + Aggregate Data from Non-HMIS List) for the period January 1, 2021 – December 31, 2021.
- Core Report in HMIS on project participants for the period January 1, 2021- December 31, 2021.
- CoC Housing Inventory and Funder lists of projects in development

### Basic Formula

For each general eligibility category for CoC project types, the following formula was used to estimate gaps:



### Adjustments applied by Committee

- Chronic homeless status: Of the households identified as chronically homeless (HUD definition) at initial assessment into Coordinated Entry, about 55% complete documentation of chronic homeless status. As a result, estimates of chronically homeless households entering CE are reduced to 55% of the counted total in Coordinated Entry data.

Priorities presented by Data & TA Committee, approved by CoC members 5/19/2022.

- Rapid Rehousing openings: Due to COVID response during calendar year 2021, the number of Rapid Rehousing entries decreased by about one-third from the typical level of entries in the region. To compensate, estimates of openings in RRH programs were increased to the typical level despite 2021 levels (2021 level x 150%).

## Household type considerations

- PSH: Single adults age 25+ and single youth aged 18-24 make up 89% of households experiencing chronic homelessness and 78% of households that include an adult with a disabling condition and experiencing HUD homelessness. 10% are families with children. 1% are minor youth.
- RRH and Joint RRH-TH (Non-DV): Single adults age 25+ and single youth aged 18-24 make up 70% of households experiencing HUD Homelessness. 28% are families with children. 2% are minor youth.
- DV RRH and Joint RRH-TH: 52% of households fleeing DV are single adults or single youth. 47% are households with parenting adults or youth. 1% are minor youth.

## Geographic considerations

- PSH: 53% of households experiencing chronic homelessness (CH) and 44% of all households eligible for HUD PSH are in Olmsted County. Blue Earth County = 13% of persons experiencing CH and 12% of other eligible households. Steele County = 8% of CH, 18% of other eligible. Rice/Goodhue together = 11% of CH and 12% of other eligible. The remaining 15 counties account for 16% of CoC PSH eligible households.
- RRH and Joint RRH-TH (Non-DV): 44% of households eligible for HUD RRH and Joint RRH-TH are in Olmsted County. 20% are in Blue Earth, 8% in Steele, and 5% in Rice. The remaining 16 counties account for 23% of eligible households.
- DV RRH and Joint RRH-TH: 43% of households identified as experiencing DV were in Olmsted County, 16% in Blue Earth, and 15% in Rice/Steele Counties together. The remaining 16 counties account for 25% of eligible households.
