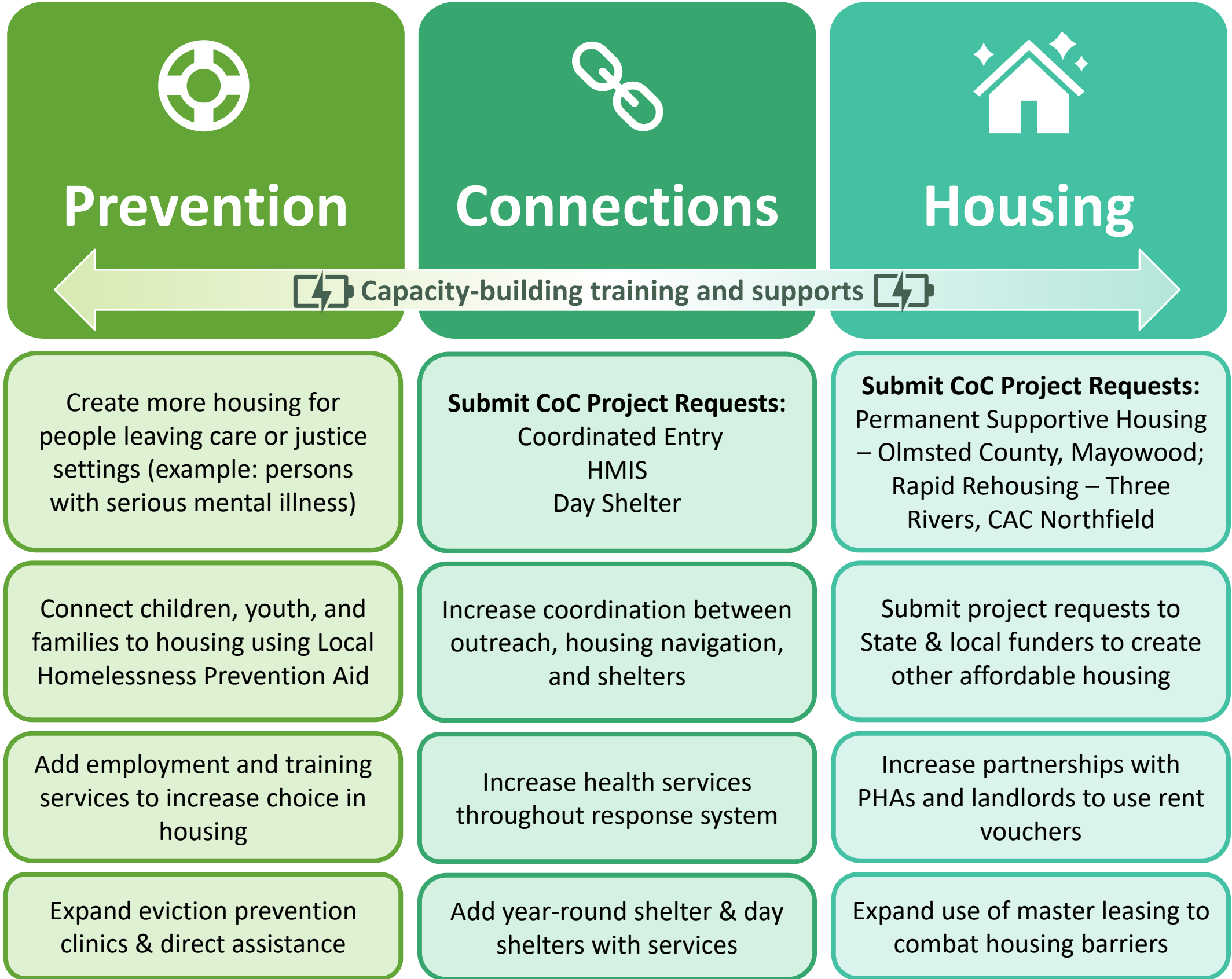


CoC Plan to Address Unsheltered & Rural Homelessness

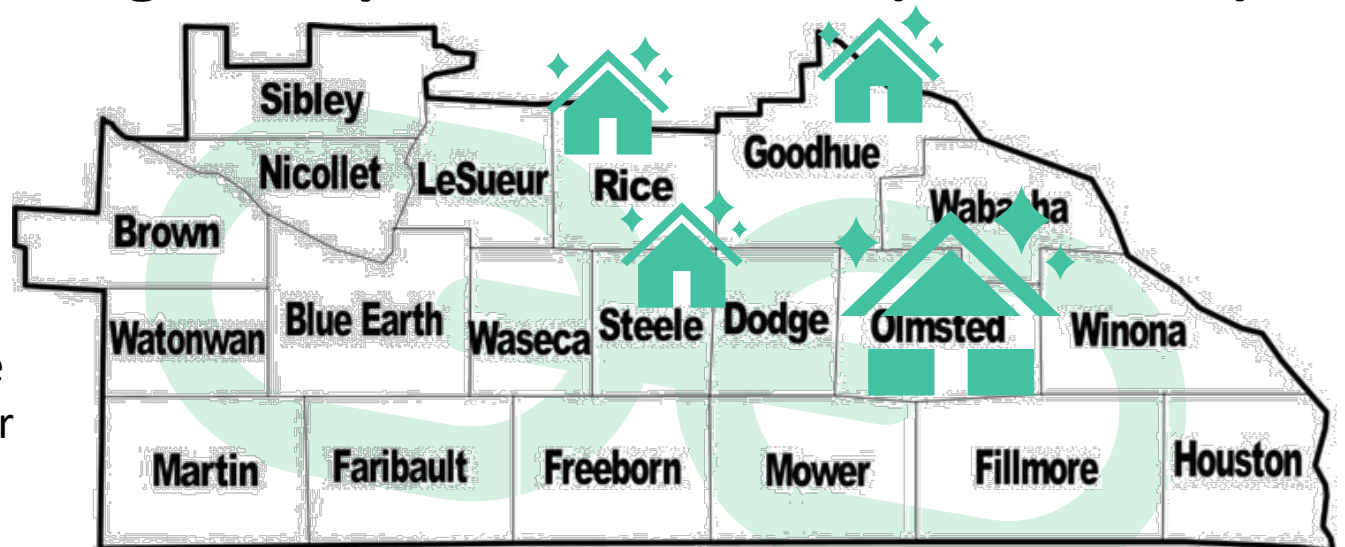
Activities



Goals

- **Decrease** the number of people without shelter by 40%
- **Decrease** average days homeless after assessment to <30 days
- **Increase** by 30% the number of housing openings available to people experiencing homelessness each year
- **Strengthen** agency ability to provide trauma-informed and culturally-responsive services

What is River Valleys CoC?

Community-based coalition of people, organizations, and local governments working together to prevent and end homelessness in southern Minnesota

and

A Continuum of Care region recognized by the federal government for funding purposes.

What kinds of decisions does a CoC make together?

- What should we do when there aren't enough resources to help everyone?
- What should we expect from programs in our area?
- How can we pick good programs to recommend for funding?
- How do we make sure that everyone can find housing?
- Who do we need to help us make good decisions together?
